

Cutter Crew Overnight Program

Sample Itinerary

The Cutter Crew Overnight is designed to give students and their chaperones the experience of living aboard a United States Coast Guard Cutter. Below is an example of a program itinerary. Due to varying group sizes, your program will probably resemble this outline but not follow it exactly. The details of the program can be discussed when the Program Director speaks with the group leaders during the pre-trip phone call.

5:00 – 5:15 PM	Assemble on Pier 5
5:00 – 6:00 PM	Orientation and Safety Briefing Pick Bunks, Stow gear
6:00 – 6:45 PM	Students are divided into Watches
6:10 – 6:45 PM	FIRST WATCH DETAIL
6:55 – 7:00 PM	Head Break
7:00 – 7:35 PM	Dinner
7:35 – 8:20 PM	SECOND WATCH DETAIL
8:20 – 8:30 PM	Head Break
8:30 – 9:45 PM	Learning Station (Navigation in Wheelhouse; Steam in Engine Room)
9:45 – 9:55 PM	Evening Snack
9:45 – 10:25 PM	Evening Entertainment (You entertain us! Time for sings or other presentations. Entertainment is not mandatory, you many use this to relax together or pow-wow time – Let Program Director know)
10:25 – 10:30 PM	Get ready for bed (Adults oriented for night watch duty shifts)
10:30 PM	Lights Out (Adults begin night watch duty shifts)
6:30 AM	Reveille, prepare for the day.
7:00 – 7:30 AM	Cook Breakfast
7:30 – 7:55 Am	Breakfast
8:00 – 9:00 AM	USS <i>Torsk</i> Tour
9:00 – 9:30 AM	Clean up or finish learning stations
9:30 – 10:00 AM	Debrief and Depart
